STATE OF MAINE.

COUNTY OF PENOBSCOT, ss. At a Circuit Court of Common Pleas, begun and holden at Bangor within and for said County, on the twenty seventh day of June 1820.

ON this twenty seventh day of June in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty, personally appeared in open court, being a court of record within and for said County and State of Maine, established by a law of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, made and passed on the eleventh day of June, A. D. 1811, and recognized by the Constitution of the State of Maine Reuben Tourtellotte

aged, fifty four years, resident in Papadumny (so called) in said County of Penobscot, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: *Was in the company commanded by Captain William Thompson in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Jeremiah Flury on the Continental establishment in the Rhode Island line upon a three years enlistment all which is more fully set forth in my original declaration made on the twenty second day of April 1800 on which declaration and the Deposition of Major John Dexter my certificate of Pension numbered 13,631 - was granted.*

Schedule of the family residing with me the said Reuben Tourtellotte who are by occupation an husbandman which I am unable to pursue by reason of having lost most of my fingers and the use of all the others except my four fingers on the left hand. & the middle finger of my right hand -

Daughter - Maria - aged 18 - years -

AND I *Reuben Tourtellotte* do solemnly swear, that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner whatever, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me: nor have I any income, other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. *Wds.*

I am greatly indebted on executions and must take this "poor debtors oath" when ever my creditors require me in jail - Reuben Tourtellotte*
