I, the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Third Eastern Circuit, of the Court of
Pleas, in said Commonwealth, including the Counties of Hancock, Washington
and Penobscot : Personally appeared *Samuel Turner*
who, being by me first duly sworn according to law, on his oath made the statement and
declaration by him subscribed, and hereto annexed, in order to obtain the provision made
by the late act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the
land and naval service of the United States, in the revolutionary war."

And thereupon, I the said Judge do certify that I am satisfied the said *Samuel*
did serve in the revolutionary war, as stated in his said decla-
ration, against the common enemy, and that he has made it appear to me, that he is in re-
duced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support.

Which proceedings and the testimony annexed, being all he has been able to produce,
I now transmit to the Secretary, for the department of War, pursuant to the directions of
the aforementioned act of Congress.

I Samuel Turner of Brewer in the County of Penobscot
do hereby testify & say that on or about the last of November
1775. I enlisted as a soldier in the Revolutionary war for
two months in Capt James McKiffs Company & Col
Joseph Reed Regt. Stationed at Roxbury: I served this time
out: & immediately enlisted again for ~~two~~ three months
in Capt. Samuel Conners Company in the same Regt.
I served this time out: & some time in July 1776. I
enlisted again for five months in Capt. Joseph Duricks
Company & Col. Moultons Regt. Under the Command of
Genl Gates: We marched on to Ticonderoga: I served
this time out and was regularly discharged in the
month of December following: I ~~was~~ again enlisted
in what was called the Rhode Island Expedition: in Capt. Ezekiel
Plimptons Company & Col Bullards Regt. Under Genl. Spencer.
We were about two months in this Expedition: When
we were all dismissed: - I served one year in the war:
but have lost all my discharges: I am now under great
circumstances: & need the assistance of my Country for
support. - I hereby relinquish all claim to any pension
or Pension on Account of my said Services.
